

CHURCH PLAN-PROCEED TO ADVANCE

The Church of God consists of the fellowship of believers in all places. At the outset, the Church is a dynamic and growing organism. What makes the early church so distinct and dynamic? One of the factors is found in Acts 2: 42:

" and they were <u>continually</u> devoting themselves to the apostles' <u>teaching</u> and the <u>fellowship</u>, to the <u>breaking of bread</u> and to prayer."

This passage tells us of the vital ingredient for a thriving and dynamic church. They are teaching, fellowshipping, worshipping and praying. The believers did not do it once or twice but continually everyday! One of the reasons they were able to do it is because they were not doing it alone - it was done corporately as a family affair. Thus they encouraged and challenged one another to press on. And the church grew with more people added daily! We must not be mistaken that the growth was due to the presence of the above factors - we must examine the scriptures - it was the mighty work of the Lord who caused the growth (Acts 2:47). However, the faithfulness of the believers was instrumental and thus the Lord worked through the various factors.

This is also the case even in this modern computer age whereby God is still active. How can our people grow spiritually? This question has been hovering in my mind for a long time. Even with the best computers or the best administrative structure etc., the church may not be able to grow a centimeter more godly. We need God - and only God the Holy Spirit can make this difference. But we must also bear our responsibility i.e. our faithfulness in our christian walk daily coupled with the preparations done like the early church in terms of learning the Word of God diligently, active and regular participation in fellowship, worship and a good prayer life, personally and corporately so that we can present each one complete in Christ. With these facts in mind, after much considerations, prayers and deliberations with other members of our congregation, I introduced the idea of the church plan to our church council and it was accepted.

This idea is to cater for the needs of our members in the area of spiritual, social, intellectual or physical. The members would be clustered into personal groups with small number of persons meeting face to face regularly for the purpose of studying the Bible and the Christian faith, for prayer, for the exchange of experiences, needs and insights, and for taking thoughts as to how we can best fulfill our calling as Christian to love and serve God and other people, encouragement, support, sense of belonging and meeting not only once a week other than Sunday worship.

Here is the breakdown of the six divisions from the areas our members come from:

- 1. Pandan/Teban
- 2. Jurong Town I (Block 1 119)
- 3. Jurong Town II (Block 120 onwards)
- 4. Boon Lay/NTI
- Jurong East/West
- 6. Clementi/NUS/City
 - * Please check the notice board for your group . If you name is missing please notify the Pastor.

There will be a few small personal groups in each area led by a trained leader. These groups will meet weekly in various homes, then corporately once a month on the last Saturday of each month for fellowship and special programmes. The programme for August 25th will be "Spot the talents" where each group is to perform a skit from a Biblical story. For September, we will be having a picnic day on the 6th (further announcement will be made later)

May the Lord help us to fulfill this task and bless us richly through these personal groups.

christian cell group

The Christian life is a battle, but we were never meant to fight alone. I not only have the Holy Spirit dwelling in me - but I also have you, with God's Holy Spirit dwelling in each of you. The question is this: Am I prepared to admit that I need help from other Christians? I'm not ashamed to admit that I need personal encouragement. This is not to say that I'm denying the all-sufficiency of Father to meet all my needs. I know He can and He does. But one of the main ways in which He does it is through other people.

I find it difficult to pray

- I need someone to exhort me and pray alongside me.

There are times when reading the scriptures are difficult

- I need someone to encourage and and instruct me.

Often I just don't know how to help my non-Christian friends.

- <u>I need someone</u> to listen to my difficulties and support me.

Sometimes my Christian life seems to be going nowhere

 I need someone who knows me, who understands me, my difficulties my weaknesses to help me find my place.

Often I can't see what's wrong with my own life; I don't know how to overcome pride, jealousy, fear, anger, a sharp tongue.

 I need someone who loves me enough to correct me that I may be more like Christ.

"We ALL need PERSONAL encouragement and exhortation, as we grow towards maturity in Christ."

That very simply is the aim of the cell group. The 'big' meetings where we worship the LORD together are necessary. But we need the "small' meeting, the cell group to allow the Holy Spirit to apply to our individual lives the practical truths of the gospel. In a big meeting, we can easily escape God's dealing. We can be all confused and mixed up inside but appear outwardly happy. Our problems do not get dealt with. But in the small meeting, its difficult to hide. This gives us an opportunity to help one another grow to be like CHRIST.

First, two foundational principles:

1. CHRIST must be CENTRAL

If our hearts are not set on CHRIST, nothing will happen. It is God Himself, through the Holy Spirit who is seeking to change our lives. We must be able to say, "Lord, I trust You, I put my life into Your hands. I want you to change me to be more like Christ, whatever it takes - hardship, trials, pain - make me like Him, Lord. I trust you know how much I can take, and You won't give me more than I can take."

2. Whatever you wish that men would do to you, DO SO TO THEM: for this is the law and the prophets. (Matt 7:12)

This is a tremendous principle. I said earlier we all have needs; here is the beginning of the answer to all our needs.

If when the group gathers and you like other people to greet you and ask about you - you take the first step and approach others.

If you have something you want to share but find it difficult and would like someone to ask you - you ask someone else first.

If you find it irritating when you're speaking and no one seems to be listening - you learn to listen to others.

If you need others to pray for you - you pray for others first.

If you need encouragement - you go and encourage others.

If you wish that others would understand instead of critizize you - you spend time to understand others first.

Finally some practical points

- Make time for fellowship
 I honestly believe that this kind of close fellowship is not
 an optional extra it's vital. I know you all have busy
 schedules but this is very important. Don't crowd it out.
- 2. Be regular in your attendance, otherwise the purpose is defeated.
- 3. Be willing to learn and to change.
 - Don't give up! Like most things in life, learning to be open and honest with others takes time to learn. You may go through a phase of frustration, disappointment but don't give up. That's precisely the time to go on. It's never easy to accept correction but we must learn. Change is always painful. Learn to embrace the pain of change.
- 4. Be willing to discipline yourself and give priority to the cell group meeting. Effective Christian living is costly and it is impossible to experience the joy of the life in Christ without paying the cost of commitment. There must be a nucleas of deeply devoted members who regard the cell as a vital part of our witness and expression of our love for Christ and one another.

THE CELL GROUP IS NOT JUST AN INTERESTING SUGGESTION, IT IS A CALL TO ACTION.

1. True Fellowship

The basis of fellowship in the Christian cell group is Christ the living truth revealed the working of the Holy Spirit in the Word of God. The Spirit of God revealing through the little groups in the early church caused the presence of the living Christ. The member of the cell group enters into a close fellowship with one another and are concerned with the application of the Word of God to the relationship that are happening in daily life.

Christians whose only contact is during the Sunday worship are lacking in one of the most important part of Christian fellowship. They need a close relationship with other Christians who will stimulate them to grow in the knowledge of Christ and to relate their faith to daily living.

2. Teaching and Training

Cell groups are not subjective sharing sessions without objective training, but should emphasise the training of its members and the need to be "transformed by the renewing of the mind".

3. Growth


The object of the cell is to reproduce itself by preparing its members to start other cells. Cell groups should complement church evangelism. Members of the cell may pray concerning friends they have witnessed to and discuss ways of making their witness more objective. Those who have expressed interest in knowing Christ may be invited to the group.

BRO TAN SWEE LEONG:



JESUS CHRIST and the Superstars *

The visit by the group, "AIR SUPPLY' sometime ago made me wonder. This group is well known for hits like 'The One That You Love', "Here I am'.. It really makes me think as to what makes them so popular, so unique, so famous, so celebrated and so accepted by everybody. Everywhere they go, fans will be waiting, screaming for them at the airport. Their records sell like hotcakes and teenagers all over idolise them. To be fair to those who don't like 'AIR SUPPLY', there is Paul McCartney or The Bee Gees to sworn over. The world is full of 'beautiful people' to adore and people are so eager so ready to set up an 'idol' and worship and adore them.

Yes, in the Old Testament, God's people turned away from Him to worship idols of stone, of gold, of Baal and of foreign gods. Today, we worship the likes of John Lennon, Rick Springfield, Slyvester Stallone and Dudley Moore. And these individuals, receiving so much adoration of their fans, became carried away in their sense of personal power. Many superstars turn to drugs and a marriage that ends in inevitable divorce as in the movie world. There is no standard in sexual morality. Still, blinded by all their show and glitter, we follow. The world is corroding. Call to decadence, moral decadence, mental decadence and spiritual decadence. It is going to lead us to HELL.

Taking about Hell, it unavoidably brings me to Jesus Christ. What has Jesus Christ to do with superstars, you may ask. Jesus doesn't cut singles, He doesn't sing songs that hit the charts. Today's teenagers don't cry for Jesus Christ like the way they cried for John lennon when he died. In fact, I think a concert by a celebrated group is worshipped with more zeal and meaning than Christ!

What happened to us? US CHRISTIANS!! While the world is eroding away morally and spiritually, what ARE we Christians doing? Are we selling 'records' for Him? Are we helping Jesus to hit the charts? Are we following the wrong crowd? Are we making our own human Gods? Instead of all these, are we conscientiously seeking the Lord, are we witnessing for Him, are we 'craving' for Him instead of some superstar? I must state that there is nothing wrong in listening to the pops. But there is something wrong if you spend time on pops when you should be spending time on His Word. There is something wrong if you listen to pops all the time instead of listening to His Word. It is certainly sobering and tragic to know that we are doing one thing instead of the other. Why try doing the 'IN Thing' when we can do the Real Thing for Jesus Christ? To round off, His word shall have the last say:

DO NOT CONFORM YOURSELVES TO THE STANDARD OF THIS WORLD BUT LET GOD TRANSFORM YOU INWARDLY BY A COMPLETE CHANGE OF YOUR MIND. THEN YOU WILL BE ABLE TO KNOW THE WILL OF GOD - WHAT IS GOOD AND IS PLEASING TO HIM AND IS PERFECT.

BOOK REVIEW

"NO TURNING BACK" By George Verwer

George Verwer is a compelling author who does not mince his words in his uncompromising approach in his books on Christian discipleship, service, lifestyle and our relation with the Lord. His recent book "No Turning Back" is not just a book to be read but one that challenges many of the things that we accept as part of the accepted way of living, he provokes us to think on the meaning of being a disciple for God and the price we have to pay, the battle to fight, the discipline we need in our Christian life. The battle, the spiritual warfare, is not ours alone for God has provided us the weapons of warfare, are we wise in using them? Are we knowledgeable in the way God can use them through us in this warfare? Are we adequately prepared so that God can use us as instruments and as weapons? As we examine ourselves, and often see our own weakness and inadequacies, we would often ask ourselves these questions. Our God is a God of might, he is the Almighty, the Sovereign, The All Sufficient, the Name Above All Name, the Name at whom all knee shall bow. As we think of the greatness of God, how can we as his children use that Great name and power for the victory that God wants to give us. Ultimately it is God who is able to give us the Victory through Christ. "No Turning Back" provides the answers, not from George Verwer, but from the Word, which is Christ himself.

The book is firmly based on Scriptures and George Verwer shares his experiences in his ministry through the work of Operation Mobilisation (OM). I am sure that in this work many battles have been fought, much hardship endured, much pain suffered, much injury sustained, much loss incurred and much sacrifices made. To the world, it would seem like loss, but should we not be like Paul who under much persecution and suffering in prison, wrote to the Philippians saying "But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ" or as Isaac Watts wrote in the hymn "My richest gain I count but loss, And pour contempt on all my pride". Are we willing to take these word and live them out as practically in our lives?

To quote an exerpt from the book, George Verwer says:

"The commandment of Christ in John 14:21 states,
 'Who ever has my commandment and obeys them, he is
 the one who loves me. He who loves me will be
 loved by my Father and I will love him'. Yet most
 people think that if they go to Church twice a
 Sunday, they are getting rather spiritual and if
 they go to the mid-week prayer meeting as well,
 they are getting super dedicated.

My prayer for this book is that it should call you to effective service and show you some of the disciples' weapons, that it should teach you how to press on when the going gets tough and that it should help you live a life of love, a life worthy of the Lord you serve."

We are all called to be disciples, learner of Christ, seeking first the Kingdom of God. Let us also draw upon the rich experience of those who have been ministered by God in their service and discipleship.

"No Turning Back" has been written in the light of the reality of the Word, Christ himself. Read it, I am sure you will find it revealing, enlightening and challenging.

"No Turning Back" is available from our Church Library.
