Indeed, "the day of the Lord" did not overtake her like a thief. She was well-prepared, being sanctified through our Lord Jesus Christ.





WHICH AGE GROUP ARE YOU IN?




Out of the 37 youths surveyed, two-thirds of them are between the age of 15 and 18, whereas one-third is below the age of 15. None of them are above 18 years of age.


WHICH ORGANISED GROUPS IN THE CHURCH ARE YOU WITH?

Less than half the responded that they are interested to join the YF, and further suggested ideas for the YF programme.





WHICH DAY WOULD YOU PREFER THE YF BE HELD?




Among those who are interested in YF, 44% prefers Sunday, 38% prefers Friday, 6% prefers Saturday, while the rest has no preference for any day.
