Pastor's Word

Peace to you all who are in Christ Jesus our Lord! We give thanks to God that some of you are serving the Lord very faithfully in JCC. Some serve in leadership, some do not. Some serve up front, others support at the background. However all of you are important serving as different parts of the body. This month we have an important leadership training seminar on October 19th towards building our community here.

There are two important Greek words used for servants in the New Testament: *doulos* δούλος and *diakonos* διακονος. The word *doulos* is a relational word, which means servant or slave. A slave belongs to someone else and has no right of his own. Paul often wrote of himself as a *doulos* of Christ e.g. Philippians 1:1. His relationship with Christ is one of total commitment.

Diakonos on the other hand is a functional one. It describes what one does for others. It can be translated as servant or minister or deacon.

Jesus himself is a servant king – two words in apposition, which seems contradicting but it is true. He is both the King of Kings (Rev 19:16) and the True Servant of Yahweh (Isaiah 42:1). In His own words, "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45). The "Son of Man" is a messianic phrase.

The story of Polish Pastor Maxmillian Kolbe is a good example of servant leadership. During the Second World War, in May 1941 Pastor

Kolbe was arrested by the Nazis (cf. Steven Spielberg's Schindler's List). He was sent to the dreaded Auschwitz



concentration camp where he was dressed in prisoner's garb and branded with the number 16670. When opportunities present themselves he spoke to other prisoners about the love of God and shared his meager ration of soup and bread with them. When asked about his sacrificial ways, he answered "Every man has an aim in life. For most men it is to return home to their wives, children and family. For my part, I want to give my life for the good of all men."

Then one day in July 1941, a prisoner supposedly broke out from the Auschwitz prison, and the camp authorities decided that at least ten prisoners must die as a reprisal. They are to be starved to death in a windowless underground bunker.

The prisoners were rounded up and made to parade under the hot noonday sun, and ten prisoners were randomly selected. One of the selected prisoner Franciszek Gajowniczek cried out in desperation, "My wife, my children, I shall never see them again." To everyone's astonishment, a man suddenly stepped out and offered to take Gajowniczek's place. It was Pastor Kolbe. The camp commandant agreed, and so prisoner no 16670 took the place of prisoner no 5659 in the death bunker. The presence of Pastor

Kolbe brought inspiration to the other nine prisoners who were dying with him. They sang hymns and have prayers in the death cells. Their guards were astounded. Like his master Jesus Christ, Kolbe laid down his life in service of others. Amen.

Chinese Mooncake Festival

A CHRISTIAN PERSPECTIVE

Introduction

The Mooncake Festival or Zhong Qiu Jie is a very important Chinese festival which is celebrated on 5th October this year. This festival is sometimes adapted and also celebrated by Chinese Christians in Singapore. Special parties with songs, lanterns, and of course mooncakes are often held. This article seeks to look at the origin, and practices of this festival. It need to be noted at the start that this festival has both a religious and also a non-religious origin, components and legend.



The festival probably originated as a mid-autumn harvest festival in

ancient China celebrated on the 15th day of the eighth moon. This is the harvest moon - the full moon closest to the Autumn Equinox, and so it must fall before or after 23 Sep. The religious worship of the moon goddess Chang Er or Chang O later became an important feature of this festival in the Tang Dynasty period (AD 618-907).

The Legend

The legend of moon goddess Chang O is a fascinating one to the Chinese. The story goes like this. Once upon a time there was a superhuman archer in China named Hao Yi. In those days there were 10 suns which scorched the earth. Yi in an amazing feat shot down 9 of the suns and the earth was saved. The people proclaimed him as their hero and emperor. Later, he became oppressive and was hated by the people. He approached the goddess Xi Wang Mu and obtained the Elixir of Immortality which he drank and remained immortal. His wife Chang O however could not tolerate his oppressive ways. She stole the Elixir of immortality and drank it. She became lighter and lighter after that and soon found herself floating to the moon and was believed to be still staying there in the moon palace to this day.

Yi went again to Xi Wang Mu and she gave him a piece of cake and talisman. Upon eating the cake he became heat resistant and was able to enter the sun and remained there. In a romantic twist to the story, it was believed each year at Zhong Qiu Jie (Mooncake festival), Yi (the sun) is reunited with his wife Chang O (the moon), thus the moon is at its brightest and fullest in the year reflecting the sun.

Mooncakes and Lanterns

The mooncake festival to the Chinese is not complete without mooncakes and colourful lanterns. From what I gather, they do not seem to have a religious origin. The practice of eating mooncake was said to have originated during the Yuan dynasty when the Chinese Han people were conquered and ruled by the Mongols. In an ingenious strategy, the rebel Chinese leaders distributed and circulated secret messages in slips of paper planted into special round cakes during the festival. These messages informed the people concerning the timing and tactics for a mass revolt against the Mongols. The revolt succeeded and the rebel leader Zhu Yuan Zhang became the first Ming emperor after the overthrow of the Yuan dynasty. It was also said that during the revolt, the Chinese people also placed special lanterns outside their houses so

that they can be identified and their homes will be spared from attack by the rebel forces.

Christian Perspective

Chinese Christians should separate the religious and non-religious elements of the mooncake festival. The practice of having an altar with jossticks, plates of pomeloes, water rhubarb (*ling kok*), peanuts, mooncakes, yam etc as offerings to the moon goddess of course cannot be continued by Christians from a Chinese background.



However in my opinion, the practice of celebrating with mooncakes and lanterns in the family at home should be all right.

Christians cannot participate in communal celebrations involving moon worship. The Bible presents a strong warning against worship of the sun and moon. They are not to be worshipped as they are created by God. God who directs their course should alone be worshipped:

Deuteronomy 4:19 - "And beware, lest you lift up your eyes to heaven and see the sun and the moon and the stars, all the host of heaven, and be drawn away and worship them and serve them, those which the Lord your God has allotted to

all the peoples under the whole heaven."

Isaiah 47:13 - "You are wearied with your many counsels; Let now the astrologers, those who prophesy by the stars, those who predict by the new moons, stand up and save you from what will come upon you."



Job 31:26-28 - "If I have looked at the sun when it shone, or the moon going in splendor, and my heart became secretly enticed, and my hand threw a kiss from my mouth, that too would have been an iniquity calling for judgment, for I would have denied God."

The Mesopotamian cities of Ur and Haran which Abraham was told to leave behind, worshipped the moon-god Sin (Summerian Nanna). The Egyptian worshipped a moon-god called Thoth. Christians are forbidden to worship the moon or other heavenly bodies. We are to be separated from such worship and remain faithful to the one true Almighty God. Amen.

In this condition, I could not drive and so we waited for a taxi. It was that time of the morning when taxis are usually hard to come by so I prayed and the Lord provided one. On the way to the hospital, I prayed for smooth traffic and that too was provided.

Knowing that doctors do not have all the answers, I prayed that the Lord grant me a doctor who could relieve my pain and so He did. The doctor

SOARING LIKE EAGLES



6 Lessons From Eagles

"They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint."

(Isaiah 40:31)

1. *Have you ever wondered why Isaiah 40:31 is written the way it is?*
2. *Why is the Eagle mentioned specifically?*
3. *What is so special about Eagles that they have a place in the bible?*
4. *What is the linkage between waiting upon the Lord and renewal of strength?*
5. *Why is it that when you mount up with wings like eagles, you do not get tired?*

Read on and you will find the answer.

The eagle is a creation of God. It is the most majestic of all birds and is mentioned many times in the bible. In fact, the eagle is mentioned 38 times, much more than the dove or other birds.

An eagle is around 90 cm tall and reaches over 2 m between the wings.

She builds her nest on the cliff or in a high tree. The nest is so large that a human can sleep in it. It can weigh 700 kg and is also comfortable.

LESSON 1: All Baby Eagles Must Learn To Fly

High in the mountains, a baby eagle is born. Like all other babies, there are two things that baby eagles, known as eaglets, love to do: eat and sleep. The baby eagle would spend its initial life in the comfort of the nest. Everyday, mama eagle would find food and drop it directly into the open mouths of the hungry eaglet. With a satisfied stomach, the eaglet then goes to sleep and the cycle continues when it becomes hungry again.

This goes on for a few weeks, until one day, mama eagle would just hover over the nest. This time, there is no food. After hovering a few rounds, mama eagle would make a dive into the nest and begins to shake it violently. She then takes one of her babies in her mouth and starts soaring into the skies. The baby eaglet begins to tremble, "Mama is mad! Mama is mad!" Suddenly, she drops the baby eaglet who starts to struggle.

Just before the eaglet smashes against the rocks, mama eagle would sweep down and pick it up. This goes on for about five to eight times.

The eaglet starts to wonder why mama is doing this. Every time it is being dropped from the sky, the

eaglet would struggle by flapping its wings.

"Mama can fly. I want to fly like her too!", the eaglet says to itself. What beautiful picture! Mama is teaching her young to fly. At about the fourteenth to fifteenth try, the eaglet begins to fly.

Christians are like baby eagles, comfortable in the nest. They come to church once a week for food. They would wait for pastor to drop "spiritual" food into their mouths. When service is over, they would go home, "sleep" for a few days and the cycle continues, until one day, something happens and they struggle. The nest gets shaken and they don't know what to do.


"It's the devil! It's the devil!" they exclaim. No, it's not! It's just our loving Father who allows our nest to be shaken because He wants us to grow into maturity, so that we can fly. It's no point being an eagle that cannot fly.

The Word of God says in Exodus 19:4 that God bare the children of Israel on eagles' wings. Here we see the eagle symbolise God. The way mama eagle treats her young shows us how God treats His children. Just when it seems like we're going under ... SWISH ... mama eagle, God, comes and picks us up. In the world, they push people upward when they are going up. But God lets us fall down to get us up.

Hard times come, but after a couple of times I start to pray a little bit more. I start to read God's word a little bit more. And suddenly I realise that the

answers to my prayers are coming. Hard times always come but I find I'm not helpless, no, I see that I can stand on God's word. What has happened? I've learned to spread my wings! I've learned to fly.

God carries us supernaturally through all our trials, even if we don't feel it. Yea, who can see the wind. While mama eagle teaches her young to use their own wings, God teaches us to believe His word and use our Faith.



LESSON 2: Eagles Are Made For The High Places

Unlike other birds that fly in the lowlands, eagles are made to fly in the high places, out of sight of the naked human eye and out of range of the hunter's rifle.

God made us to fly in the high places, free from the world's control. A tourist to the Jurong Bird Park once commented that the eagles there looked very clean. In reply, the bird-keeper said: "When eagles are in freedom, they are the cleanest birds. But when they are in captivity, they are the dirtiest."

God made us pure and holy to conform to the image of His Son. If Christians are in captivity, that is, subjected to the ways of the world, we can be the "dirtiest" of all creatures. Unless we "fly" in the high places, out of the world's control, and according to how God has made us, we'll remain the dirtiest of creatures.

LESSON 3: Eagles Do Not Fly, They Soar

Eagles do not fly like other birds, flapping their wings profusely and using their own strength. Instead, eagles SOAR majestically, making use of the wind currents to gain height. What makes the eagle so special is that she sits on the rock and reads the wind and when the time is perfect she takes off and soars upward with her great wings. There is a special up going wind where the eagle rides the wind and circle higher and higher toward the sky, without effort. She just spreads her wings.

The wind is referred many times in the bible as the Holy Spirit. We can learn to cooperate with the Holy Spirit and let Him lift us closer to Jesus. The eagle in this case is the Christian who is being lifted by the Holy Spirit up and closer to Jesus. Like eagles, we should learn to ride on the current of the Holy Spirit, instead of relying on our own strength.

Only then can we "gain height" to "fly" in the high places. Isaiah 40:31 talks about growing in Christ, that happens when we have fellowship with Him in the Spirit.

LESSON 4: Eagles Go Through Specific Periods Of Renewal

When they are about 60 years old, eagles go through a period of renewal. An eagle would find a secret place up in the mountains. It would start to claw at its face and tear out the feathers that have been damaged over the years. As a result, it would bleed badly. The eagle would then wait patiently for the rays of the sun to heal it. Through this, the eagle

renews its strength by getting rid of the unnecessary things otherwise it would not be able to live till 120 years that it normally does.

Like eagles, Christians need to go through a renewal period sometime in our lives, to rid ourselves of unnecessary things and to wait upon the Lord. Renewal is a divine principle where God cuts off the unfruitful things in us so as to bring out the fruitful.

LESSON 5: Eagles Get Sick, Just Like Humans

When an eagle gets sick, it does not go to the doctor. It simply finds a favourite spot in the mountains and await the rays of the sun to heal it. The sun plays a major role in the life of an eagle and as such, is a major source of healing too.


When we get sick, besides going to the doctor, do we also look to the Lord who plays a major role in our lives as our source of healing?

LESSON 6: Every Eagle Has To Die

When an eagle is about to die, it will fly to its favourite spot in the mountains, wraps its wings round itself, looks at the sun's rays and dies.

Ideally, all Christians should die looking towards Jesus as our source of hope and comfort.
