

We are nearing the end of the year again. As we reflect upon our days we remember good times and bad times. Life has its ups and downs. Sometimes we are at the pink of health and sometimes we may be sick. When sickness comes we feel pain and sufferings. Many Christians ask this: Why God did not heal me whenever I am sick and I pray to Him; why I still need to see the doctor? This boils down to the fundamental question: Does God

always heal? Some Christians when they are sick are taught by their leaders not to see a doctor but to fast and pray. Is this okay?

The following thoughts by Mr Walter Martin, a well known Christian writer is helpful. You may not agree with everything he wrote but it is still


worth reading:

Does God Always Heal?

First Peter 2:24 says of Christ, "He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, so that we might die to sins

and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been heaied."

One of the primary rules of biblical interpretation, which must never be violated, is context. What is the context in 1 Peter 2? Answer: Salvation. There is no way to interpret it in any other sense. The verse is talking about Jesus on the cross dying for us, enduring punishment and bearing our sins, thereby providing salvation for us.



for the physical body, regardless of whether the context indicates otherwise.

A number of times in Scripture the word healing have specific reference to spiritual healing. There

are diseases of the soul that have to be healed -- and the primary disease of the soul is man's unregenerate state, which is rooted in sin. The good news is that God has provided healing for this disease of the soul. And that is what Peter is talking about in 1 Peter 2:24. He is not saying that physical healing of the body is guaranteed to every believer.

Certainly, healing for the body is a benefit of Christ's death on the cross, a benefit for the church as a result of His atoning sacrifice. However, it is not -- it has never been in the history of the church -- a guarantee that God has to heal your body; He doesn't have to!

God does say He will graciously entertain our prayers. He says that if we exercise faith, and if our request is in accordance with His will, He will hear us. But He mever said that the mark of true spirituality is that you would never be sick.

Some within the church will try to tell you, "God's perfect will is that you are never going to be sick." Well, I'll tell you something: there are certain lessons -- if you are honest -- that you'll admit you never would have learned unless the Lord flattened you out long enough to get your attention. Sometimes God teaches us things through our suffering.

Moreover, I must say that sometimes a person, after praying for a healing, may receive a no from God -- a benevolent no, a kindly no, a protective no maybe, but no nevertheless. Tragically, however, there are teachers -- in the Faith movement, for example -- who have the colossal gall to tell people that if they were more spiritual, if they had more faith, if they believed like they believed, they would be well. Such faulty teaching can crush whatever faith these poor people have.

Now, I believe you should go to the Lord and believe Him for healing, and trust Him for healing, and pursue Him for healing. And I believe you should search your soul to make certain there is nothing in your life standing in the way of healing. But you must come to Him and lay yourself out on conditions. The Scripture says, "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us" (1 John 5:14). If perhaps God intends to teach you something through an illness. He might not heal you immediately.

So don't think you are being neglected by the Holy Spirit if you don't get healed. Don't assume that the Lord is against you. Don't conclude that you necessarily have an absence of faith or secret sin.

Take a good look at 1 Peter 2:21: "Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps." Circle the word example in this verse. Here we are told that Jesus suffered. And He left us an example. We are to follow in His steps.

And what is the meaning of Philippians 3:10, which refers to "the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings"? Let us be clear on this: suffering is an integral part of the fact of life, and is often used by God in the development and maturation of the Christian.

The apostle Paul had a greater standing with the Lord in terms of his ministry than I have or anybody else has ever had. According to 2 Corinthians 12:1-10 Paul requested healing from the Lord three times. And three times he got an answer back: "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness." Translation: God said no to Paul's request for healing. And God had a purpose in saying no.

Did Paul have lack of faith? Rubbish! Was Paul suffering from some secret sin that he was carrying around? Do you see how utterly absurd this is? Do you see how it plays on people's emotions and lives? Do you see how it undermines faith in the absolute authority of Scripture and transfers it

to a human being whose experience becomes the criteria?

This type of teaching eats like a cancer in the body of Christ and it must be resisted and opposed at every opportunity so that Christians will not have a cloud hanging over their heads all the time. Instead, they will realize that Jesus really does love them (despite their illness) and that any healing that may come is in His sovereign hands, not ours.

May the Lord heal us in our infirmities spiritually and physically. Amen.



"MIRACLES OR MAGIC?", magician Andre Kole wrote a whole chapter on God's Healing Business. Preceding this chapter, Andre wrote about his wife's death from a brain tumor. In God's Healing Business, Andre asked why some people give dramatic testimonies about God's healing, while others are left

wondering if God even heard their prayers. He reveals that today there are a number of television evangelist/faith healers who prey on the hopes of people who are suffering. These people use trickery and deception to attract thousands of followers and millions of dollars but they also leave many people confused about how God works.

He mentions 3 particular persons and gives examples of how their deception is done. The gift of knowledge is achieved by these preachers having assistants who walk through the auditorium striking up casual conversations, or pass out cards for prayer requests. The information gathered thus is then passed to the preacher in paper slips or through a small transmitter.

used where people, are slightly who unsteady in their walk as they enter the auditorium, are invited by an usher to sit in a wheel-They are chair. then pushed to the front and then dramatically ordered to stand gu and walk. Of course they can the to rousing applause of the crowd.



Faith healing means that a person is relieved of symptoms or healed because of his faith. A doctor sometimes uses the principles of faith to his advantage. He may prescribe sugar pills to help a patient believe he is getting helpful medicine. He may use suggestions like, "You should start feeling better in two days." Sometimes this really helps a person recover.

Divine healing is God supernaturally reaching down and miraculously healing a person. God is not required to perform in a theatrical setting. He can work anywhere. God sometimes chooses not to heal, like in the case of Joni Eareckson Tada.

Andre Kole is indeed a man who loves God. Because of his special skills as a magician, he is able to

discover some of the tricks played by faith healers on innocent victims. We must realize that God can heal us regardless of our level of faith, if He chooses to. So, do not fall into the "lack of faith" trap. Read Pastor Yee's story about Paul, the apostle.

Since 1950, Dr. Bill Bright, founder and president of Campus Crusade for Christ. dreamed of developing an appealing biblically accurate film about the life Christ. He saw how the life-changing message of Jesus Christ could reach the world's millions-

especially the illiterate—with greater impact through the medium of film. A film utilizing both sight and sound to deliver the message of Christ could provide a powerful evangelistic tool that would bring the gospel message alive.

Done accurately, adhering faithfully to Scriptures—Dr. Bright foresaw a film that could be translated and re-recorded into the languages of the world.

A team of 500 scholars and leaders from a variety of secular and Christian organizations began a five-year program in the mid-1970s to determine how to best portray Jesus on the motion picture screen. The team agreed that the film must meet five important criteria:

- The film must be as archaeologically, historically and theologically accurate as humanly possible.
- The presentation must be unbiased, acceptable to all as a true depiction of Christ's life.
- The film story must appeal to all ages.
- The script must be easily translatable into virtually any language on earth.
- The film must be of theater-viewing quality, and effective with both urban and rural audiences worldwide.

In 1978, "JESUS" was produced at a cost of \$6 million, primarily funded by a businessman and long-time friend of Campus Crusade for Christ International.

John Heyman, a film producer and financier with more than 30 films to his credit, provided the driving force behind the production of "JESUS".

If you opened the Bible on your shelf to the Book of Luke right now, you would encounter the script of the film. The action and most of the words spoken by actors and narrator alike were recorded in Scripture. In the film, virtually every word spoken by Jesus is taken directly from the Gospel according to Luke.

After a six-month search and 263 screen tests, the lead role was awarded to English Shakespearean actor Brian Deacon. His portrayal of Jesus was so convincing that bystanders often broke into applause at the end of his speeches.

Before its release, the film changed the lives of many who were involved. A college dropout who worked with props on the film received Christ as Savior and Lord. A Warner Bros executive also asked Christ to come into his life after a distribution planning meeting.

Wamer Brothers distributed the completed film, and "JESUS" opened in U.S. theaters in late 1979.

Within a year, millions of Americans in 2,000 theaters had seen the "JESUS" film, inspiring many decisions by viewers across the country to accept Christ into their lives.

But, as already stated, from it's inception the "JESUS" film was envisioned as an evangelistic tool to be used worldwide. The film was produced to fully support that vision. The simple narrative taken straight from the Gospel of Luke made it easily adaptable for translation into any language.

To make this vision a reality, the film project needed a strong and capable leader. Dr. Bright asked Paul Eshleman, who had been involved with the film from the start, to head The JESUS Film Project. And thus, this worldwide evangelistic film ministry was born.

THAI STUDENTS SHOW "JESUS" TO TRIBAL PEOPLE

University students from the city of Chiang Mai [chang MY], Thailand, recently conducted a summer outreach in a remote tribal area of their country. The students raised thier own finances to participate.

Along with assisting a missionary in the region, the students also conducted "JESUS" film showings. Many villagers attended despite threatening thunderstorms and clouds of bugs flying into the projector. Organizers report that many viewers prayed aloud, indicating their desire to receive Christ. Project leaders were encouraged by the response, but even more by the desire of the eager students to visit other such villages with the message of Christ.

"JESUS" FILM VIEWER HEALED OF ASTHMA

When the announcement came from, of all places, a Muslim mosque, that a film on the life of Jesus Christ would soon be shown, one Pakistani man attended, hoping to request healing for his asthma.

He reports that as he watched the "JESUS" film, taken directly from Luke's Gospel, Jesus seemed to be asking him, "What can I do for you?" This occurred during a scene in which a blind man is healed. The man bowed his head and prayed for healing. Instantly, he began to breathe with ease. Three months later, when film workers met with him, his asthma condition had not returned.

SPIRITUAL BATTLE IN BORNEO

A ministry team went into the jungles of Borneo to show the "JESUS" film to the Iban [EE-bahn] people. On their first day there, the team encountered a negative response. That night, one ministry worker dreamed of losing a hand-to-hand battle with a host of evil spirits. As the dream went on, he called out to Jesus, then killed all the spirits.

The following morning, some people from the area told the team they wanted Jesus as their Savior! In one month alone, 763 villagers saw the "JESUS" film and 174 of them indicated decisions for Christ. Eighty-four were baptized.

"JESUS" FILM HELPS ACCELERATE WORLD EVANGELIZATION

Revelation 5:9 states, "Thou...didst purchase for God with Thy blood men from every tribe and tongue and people and nation." Many Christians see this as a description of God's work on earth today.

Mission agencies are partnering together as never before to work toward completion of the Great Commission, and increasingly, the "JESUS" film is helping them get the job done. To date, 450 agencies have taken this biblical portrayal of Luke's Gospel to more than 766 million people in 364 language versions.






GLORIOUS!

LUTHERAN CHURCH IN SINGAPORE IN THE NEW MILLENNIUM

GENERAL OUTLINE OF THE PLAN

The plan will be evolved around the propagating of the shared vision amongst the congregations, strengthening the unity and cooperation of our members and fervor recruiting of new members. All these tasks must be initiated and supervised dedicatedly by all church pastors and parish workers. The collective efforts by all must be sustained throughout the five years, through proper planning and coordination by all involved.

Sharing of Vision - Vision sharing is the first step to success. Unless there are effective ways to disseminate and explain the vision, it is unlikely that objective of shared vision can be realized. The followings are some methods that can be explored for this purpose.

- Newsletters publicizing the shared vision through a half-yearty newsletter from the LCS with specific theme in each edition.
 These themes should be emphasied again in the various newsletters circulated in the various churches.
- Poster produce posters and brochures related to the shared vision periodically to complement the newsletters.
- LCS Diary incorporate the shared vision and the work plan in the yearly LCS diary.
- d. Announcement on Sunday Worship Services Whenever possible inject the shared vision and targets of the church during sermons.

<u>Enhancement of Unity</u> - Unity is strength. However, unity does not come naturally. Deliberate activities must be created for ice breaking to promote collaboration which in turn unify our members. These activities must be jointly organized by different congregations in order to achieve maximum effectiveness.

a. Joint Retreat - encourage and promote joint retreat. This can be achieved first through the joint retreat of Chinese and English congregations within a church to that of at least two churches in each joint retreat. This will help in enhancing the unity of church members.

- Joint Reformation Day Service Can be organized in a small scale from joint service in the church to joint-church service at a later stage.
- LCS Family Day Family Day can be organized as an activity to strengthen our tie as a Lutheran family.
- d. Exchange of Pulpit This will help pastors and church members to get to know each other.

<u>Church Renewal</u> - Church renewal is of utmost importance for spiritual build up. In the absence of such renewal, the church is no more than a beautiful building that house wayward souls. Nevertheless, this aspect of growth needs the undivided attention and dedication of the Parish workers.

- a. Prayer Organize prayer campaign periodically to promote the habit of praying collectively in the churches. Organize prayer seminar and conduct prayer training to arouse members' interest in praying. Establish prayer chain within the congregation to show the effect of praying. Organize special prayer meetings to meet members' needs.
- Enhancing members' biblical knowledge Conduct Bible classes and seminar to elevate the members' knowledge in Bible. Conduct Bible competition to sustain interests.
- Long Term Planning for Church Ministry Develop a long term development and growth plan for the various church ministry.
- d. Learning from other churches Conduct study trips locally and abroad, attending seminars, conferences and revival meetings in order to improve the practice of churches in terms of evangelism and education.

Evangelism - One of the most common set backs in church growth is the lack of effective evangelism. Focus must be directed to this facet in our plan for the next few years. Relentless effort must be put in to organize the followings:

- Local church evangelism meetings Conduct local church evangelism meeting at least once a year per church.
- b. Tracting
- c. Personal Evangelism Conduct training to members on how personal evangelism is carried out and to use this tools to recruit new members in the "one for one" campaign.

<u>Leadership Training</u> - Resources must be channeled to the grooming of church leaders Good leaders will attract good followers. And this is what our church need. The church should Identify suitable candidates for leadership training. They in turn can be the potential church leaders helping the church in the various ministries. The following programs must be put in place for this purpose.

- a. Pastoral Training Identify potential leaders to attend theological training. More church workers are required in the next five years to fill the gaps in the additional three new churches and two social work centres. Therefore, in the next year or so, potential candidates must be sent for theological training. Programs will also be organized to refresh and upgrade pastors for the betterment of ministry.
- Church Council Training Programs This must be organized to upgrade the knowledge and skill of the council members.
- Diaconate Training Programs Members with potential must also be selected to attend this program in order to assist the church.
- d. Training for Mobilization

Church Planting and Social Ministry

- Survey- Identify good location for three new churches and two social work centres
- b. Church Growth Seminar and Training
- C. Team Work

Cell Group Ministry - An effective way to increase church members. Well-planned grouping with effective leaders will go a long way in the recruitment of new members.

Increase of Worship Services - With increased members it is hoped that the church would be able to increase Worship Services.



EXECUTION

It will be a multi-pronged five years plan to be accomplished in phases as follows.

- a. Phase I (1999-2000) The Infancy Phase This phase will focus on foundation laying. Much preparations need to be done to ensure the smooth build up of the church. The following are the main tasks:
- Publicize shared vision through deliberate publicity means.
- (2) Identify potential church workers and members for grooming.
- (3) Promote unity through church level retreats.
- (4) Train members for evangelical work.
- (5) Establish prayer training class and prayer class
- (6) Conduct Bible study class.
- (7) Recruit church workers
- (8) Set member recruitment target at 500.
- Phase II (2001-2002) The Growing Phase This phase
 will be built on the foundation laid in the first two years. Apart
 from continuing with the momentum achieved in the first phase,
 the following must be carried out.
- Organize praying seminar to strengthen our faith.
- (2) Conduct Bible seminar and competition to enhance member's biblical knowledge.
- (3) Conduct leadership training for selected members.
- (4) Conduct inter-churches (confine to 2) retreats to enhance unity.
- (5) Recruit more church workers.
- (6) Establish one new church or place of worship and one social work centre.
- (7) Recruit another 1000 members.
- c. Phase III (2003-2004) The Consolidation Phase All the jobs must be completed in this two years. Effort must be put in to sustain the interest and growth created in the previous phases. The main tasks of this phase are:
- Conduct major LCS retreats encompassing members of various churches.
- (2) Recruiting of more church workers for new churches and social

work centre.

- (3) Enhance total membership of church to 6000.
- (4) Establish two new churches and one social work centres.

In order to fulfil the requirements in the outlined plan, the collaboration of all the pastors and lay leaders are required. The following are the tasks allocated to the respective pastors, leaders or committees

- a Propagating shared vision through the production of newsletter, posters, brochure etc
- Enhancing members' unity by organization of joint activities
- Spiritual building for church renewal
- d. Evangelism
- e. Leadership Training
- f. Church Planting
- g. Social Work Ministry
- h. Increasing of Worship Services

BUDGET

The treasurer will make provision in budgeting for the promotion of these activities and special projects each year.

Activities carried out within the respective churches will be self-funded.

CONCLUSION

Let us accept this vision as a "New Land" that God Is giving us In the new millennium. Though there may be people of great size and fortified cities along our way, we can declare confidently as what Caleb has said, "We should go up and take possession of the land, for we can certainly do it." Num. 13:17-30)

With the mighty power of God and His guidance, together with our dedication, unity and common resources, we shall be able to achieve our goal successfully.
